Mission Co-op Sunday – June 26-27

Next weekend our parish will welcome **Sister Vera Komar** from the Sisters of the Holy Trinity. Here is some background on the work of the Trinitarian Sisters and how we can help.



I am a Sister of the Holy Trinity, (Trinitarian Sister).

Our Congregation was founded in Madrid, Spain 1885 by Father Francisco Mendez from Spain and Mother Mariana Allsopp Manrique from Mexico. We were founded to help girls and

young adults in most need, to offer them a DOOR THAT IS ALWAYS OPEN, to free them from the slavery of prostitution, drugs and dramatic experiences of sexual and physical abuse, poverty and coming from broken homes.

We have our Mission in Spain, Italy, Mexico, Argentina, Guatemala and just started our Mission in India. The Mission Appeal is for Mexico.

I am Canadian, born in Cambridge (Galt) Ontario, of parents who were immigrants from the Ukraine after World War II. I have most of my family in this area, Cambridge, Hamilton and Boston and my Father passed away 15 years ago. I have been home for the past year taking care of my Mother who recently turned 88 years old.

I entered the Congregation in Spain, April 2nd, 1978 and lived in Spain for almost 18 years. Up until the present I have been stationed in Mexico since Oct. of 1995.

In Mexico we have 6 Missions or as they are called, CASA HOGAR, translated as HAVEN HOME, for girls from 12 to 18 years old and for young adults from 18 to 25 years old.

In Mexico our other Ministries consist of: visiting the Women's Prison, visiting the people who live on the streets, and also going to Mountains working with the Natives. All of this I hope to explain on my Mission appeal.

On behalf of the Mother Delegate, Sister Velia Acosta Tafoya and all the Sisters of the Holy Trinity from the Mexicana Delegation, thank you for opening your Doors so that this appeal may be made.
