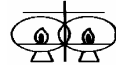

### **PONTIFF OFFERS CURÉ D'ARS AS MODEL FOR LAITY**

VATICAN CITY, JUNE 27, 2010 ([Zenit.org](http://Zenit.org)).- Benedict XVI offered St. John Mary Vianney, known as the Curé d'Ars, as a role model not only for priests, but also for the laity.

The Pope said this today upon receiving in audience a delegation representing the Circolo San Pietro (Circle of St. Peter), an Italian charity founded in 1869.

"A short while ago we concluded the Year for Priests," the Holy Father said, "a time of grace during which the Church reflected with special attention on the figure of St. John Marie Vianney, the holy Curé d'Ars, observing the 150th anniversary of his death."

"He is a model of evangelical life not only for priests, but for laypeople, especially for those who work, as you do, in the vast field of charity," the Pontiff affirmed. "A peculiar aspect of the life of this humble priest was, in fact, his detachment from material goods. He did not own anything, he gave everything away to the most needy; it did not feel the necessity of having anything for himself: He considered everything superfluous.

"He learned the love of the poor as a boy, seeing how they were welcomed and helped by his parents

at home. This love led him, in the course of his priestly life, to give away everything he had. He also founded a home that he called Providence for poor children and girls: He dedicated every effort to them so that they would receive a healthy Christian education."

"May his example constitute for you, dear members of the Circolo San Pietro, a constant invitation to open your arms to every person who has need of a tangible sign of solidarity," Benedict XVI continued. "Continue to be a concrete sign of the Pope's charity to whomever finds themselves in need, whether materially or spiritually, and to the pilgrims who come to Rome from every part of the world to visit the tombs of the Apostles and to meet the Successor of Peter."

### **CARITAS: FOOD CRISIS IS URGENT FOR G-8, G-20**

ROME, JUNE 24, 2010 ([Zenit.org](http://Zenit.org)).- The international Caritas aid agency says world leaders meeting this weekend in Canada must focus on the rising food crisis.

In a statement released Wednesday, Caritas affirmed the urgency of the food crisis, and urged the Group of Eight and Group of 20 representatives to tackle the problem when they meet this Friday through Sunday.

"Decades of misguided economic and agricultural policies have finally become too much for farmers and people around the world to withstand," the Caritas statement affirmed. "A record 1 billion people are now chronically hungry. One in every seven does not have the food needed for basic life."

The aid organization asserted that the G-8 and G-20 countries, with their developed and emerging economies, "must reverse global food policies by supporting small-scale, sustainable agriculture in developing countries, over industrial agriculture."

"We need more aid, better spent. And we need to see effective action on climate change," affirmed Michael Casey, Caritas Canada's executive director.

Food security is expected to be further impacted by climate change.

Caritas called on rich countries to commit an additional U.S. \$195 billion in public financing per year by 2020 to support poor countries in their adaptation to climate change and to develop sustainably.
